

On the presenters:

Prof. Joel Robbins is Jane and Aatos Erkkö Visiting Professor in Studies on Contemporary Society at University of Helsinki and Professor of Anthropology at the University of California, San Diego. His research interests include religion, ritual, the cross-cultural study of Christianity, social exchange, and the anthropological study of morality. He has conducted extensive fieldwork in Papua New Guinea.

Karen Lauterbach is Assistant Professor at the Centre of African Studies, University of Copenhagen and Researcher at the Centre for Theology and Religious Studies, Lund University. She has done extensive research on Christianity in Africa and in particular on the making of pastoral careers. She is currently doing research on Congolese churches in Kampala, Uganda and will embark on a new project that deals with understandings of wealth in African diaspora churches.

Naomi Haynes is a Chancellor's Fellow in the Department of Social Anthropology at the University of Edinburgh. Haynes earned her PhD in anthropology at the University of California, San Diego. Her research interests include the Anthropology of Christianity, political economy, the prosperity gospel, exchange, and hierarchy. Haynes is currently revising her dissertation for publication as an ethnographic monograph; in the future, she plans to conduct comparative research on Pentecostalism in Latin America.

Prof. Jan-Åke Alvarsson, is Professor of Cultural Anthropology at Uppsala University. He is an anthropologist of religion who has studied South American mythology, Amerindian religion, Scandinavian and Latin American Pentecostalism as well as the encounter between Pentecostalism and indigenous religions.

Dr. Carl Sundberg, is post-doc researcher at Lund University researching revealed medicine in the Evangelical Church in Congo. He has spent 10 years in both Congo and taught at theological faculties in Brazzaville as well as Kinshasa. Dr Sundberg has periodically worked in Congo Brazzaville since 1982 and carried out academic fieldwork since 1993.
