**Submission of papers:**

For the NIME seminar, follow the instructions e-mailed to you later.

For Lund seminars:

1. The paper presenter uploads the paper in Google docs and e-mails an invitation to the active research seminar participants. The deadline is on Wednesday on the week before the seminar. Papers posted after the deadline will not be dealt with in the seminar.
  - a. The paper maximum length is 15 text pages.
  - b. All papers are to be preceded by a disposition of the dissertation, if such already exists.
  - c. The presenter is to note whether the paper is an idea paper/research plan, a draft or a manuscript.
2. All of the seminar participants comment the paper(s) in commentary bubbles at latest on Monday.
  - a. An idea paper/research plan: the comments should deal with the ideas: plausibility, logic etc.
  - b. A draft: comments on structure, argumentation, style, coverage etc.
  - c. A manuscript: as above but more attention also to language and formalia.
3. The paper presenter reads the comments on Tuesday and prepares questions/topics to be discussed on the basis of the paper and the comments. The presenter has quite free hands to decide about the format of dealing with the paper/the topics it raises.

The participation in these Lund seminars requires a commitment and is open only to those participants who are willing and able to commit themselves to continuous work with the seminar, i.e. even in the case of not being able to participate, to comment the papers.
