European societies have taken different paths and found new ways of offering religious knowledge across traditions. In East, South East and South Asia, religious diversity has been a lived reality for centuries while we can trace the emergence of the semantic category of "religion" in the Sinitic languages towards the end of the 19th century only. How does religious and value education currently look like across Asia? What are new approaches to adapt to the needs of global citizens, and how do these approaches relate civic and religious values? How can the rise of Life Education be understood? This conference intends to create a stimulating Asian-European exchange related to educational concepts of religion and value education.
